ANTON POZNIAK (UK) President of the International AIDS Society. Doctor's degree at the University of Bristol UK. Doctorate in TB/HIV and HIV researcher at King's College from London. Consultant Physician at the Chelsea and Westminster Hospital and HIV Director. Honorary professor of the London School of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene. Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians. Board member of the European AIDS Clinical Society and member of the EACS ARV guidelines panel. President of the European AIDS Trial Network NEAT-ID. Main investigator for a Test and Treat project in Tanzania. He is on the board of the Charity CUAMM UK.



DANIEL PODZAMCZER (Spain) Chief, HIV Unit, Infectious Disease Service, Hospital Universitari de Bellvitge (HUB). He is a member of Expert Panels for Recommendations of Prevention and Treatment of Opportunistic Infections (NIH/CDC/IDSA), Antiretroviral Therapy (GESIDA, Spain), Neurocognitive Disorders (GESIDA, Spain). He obtained his Medical Degree at the University of Buenos Aires, Argentina and his Residence in Internal Medicine at the HUB, Barcelona, Spain.



ESTEBAN MARTÍNEZ (Spain) Senior Consultant in Infectious Diseases at Hospital Clinic of Barcelona. Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Barcelona. Member of the Scientific Board of the International Workshop on Adverse Drug Reactions and Co-morbidities in HIV. He is a member of the editorial boards of AIDS Research and Therapy, HIV Medicine, Journal of Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndromes, AIDS, and Journal of Antimicrobial Chemotherapy.



CARLOS DEL RÍO (US) MD, is the Hubert Professor and Chair of the Hubert Department of Global Health, Professor of Medicine in the Division of Infectious Diseases and Professor of Epidemiology at the Rollins School of Public Health of Emory University. Principal Investigator and co-director of the Emory Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) and co-Principal Investigator of the Emory-CDC HIV Clinical Trials Unit. Member of the Board of Directors of the International Antiviral Society in USA and Chair of the PEPFAR Scientific Advisory Board.



JAVIER MARTÍNEZ PICADO (Spain) is an ICREA Research Professor at the AIDS Research Institute IrsiCaixa in Barcelona, where he leads the Retrovirology and Clinical Studies group. He is also an associate professor at the University of Vic (UVIC-UCC). He received his PhD in Microbiology from the University of Barcelona. He later engaged in HIV/AIDS research at the Harvard Medical School (Boston). His current scientific interests focus on understanding how HIV causes disease and the research of cure strategies. He co-leads the ICIStem consortium to investigate the potential for HIV cure by allogeneic stem cell transplantation.

DIEGO CECCHINI (Argentina) Doctor of Medicine graduated from Buenos Aires University. Medical specialist in Infectious Diseases at Hospital General de Agudos "Dr. Cosme Argerich" and Helios Salud. Main investigator of clinical trials on new therapeutic strategies for HIV. Current member of SADI, SADIP and IAS.



JORGE ZIRULNIK (Argentina) Doctor specialist in psychiatry. Staff member of Infectology and HIV Division on Buenos Aires Fernández Hospital. Main promoter of the investigation of the HIV neurocognitive disorder in Argentina. Member of the First Consensus on HIV-AIDS Neurocognitive Disorders. Currently, he is working in the interaction between HIV-brain-aging and in the development of a brief psychotherapy device to be applied in people-HIV with psychological failure of adherence to antiretroviral treatment.



RICARDO DÍAZ (Brazil) Infectious Diseases trained physician. Professor at the Infectious Diseases Division and Head of the Retrovirology Laboratory at Paulista School of Medicine on University of Sao Paulo. Member of the "Brazilian Consensus Guidelines for Antiretrovirals for Adults and Adolescents of the Brazilian Ministry of Health". Consultant of the Laboratory of STI/AIDS and Viral Hepatitis Department of the Brazilian Ministry of Health.



GUSTAVO LOPARDO (Argentina) Professor of Infectious Diseases at Buenos Aires University and CEMIC University Institute. Clinical Consultant of Infectious Diseases of the Dr. Bernardo Houssay Municipal Hospital. Coordinator of the Fundación del Centro de Estudios Infectológicos (FUNCEI). Former president of the Argentine Society of Infectious Diseases (SADI). Member of the Advisory Board of the National AIDS of the Argentine Ministry of Health. Co-chairman of the XVIII Congress of the International Society for Infectious Diseases in Buenos Aires, Argentina.



ALICIA PIÑEIRÚA (Mexico) Doctor Specialist in infectology by the National Institute of Medical Sciences and Nutrition Salvador Zubirán. Professor of Public Health from Emory University.
