A physician, infectious diseases specialist and epidemiologist, with over 40 years experience in the promotion of public health, international technical cooperation, and the development of health programs. Former Assistant Director (DPM/WHO) and two terms Director of the Pan-American Health Organization, PAHO, Regional office for WHO in the Americas.



Estevao Portela (BRAZIL)

Infectious diseases specialist doctor, with most of his professional experience in the field of HIV and Viral Hepatitis and more than 15 years of experience in Clinical Research, including his role as Principal Investigator in multicenter randomized clinical trials. Principal Investigator and co-director of the Emory Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) and co-Principal Investigator of the Emory-CDC HIV Clinical Trials Unit.



Daniel Kuritzkes (UNITED STATES)

MD received his BS and MS degrees in Molecular Biophysics and Biochemistry from Yale University, and his MD from Harvard Medical School. He completed his clinical and research training in internal medicine and infectious diseases at Massachusetts General Hospital. He is now the Harriet Ryan Albee Professor of Medicine and Chief, Division of Infectious Diseases at Brigham and Women's Hospital.



Michelle Moorhouse (SOUTH AFRICA)

Graduated from Wits University in South Africa, soon after which she became involved in the management of people living with HIV, and co-founded the first HIV clinical trial center in Port Elizabeth, South Africa. She is now working as a consultant to Wits Reproductive Health and HIV Institute, where she is involved in HIV and STI prevention studies and a number of COVID-19 studies.



Giovanni Ravasi (UNITED STATES)

Medical Doctor, specialized in Infectious Diseases from the Università degli Studi di Pavia, Italy, and holds a Master Degree in Public Health from the London School of Hygiene in Tropical Medicine, London, UK. Since 2008 works as Regional Adviser on HIV and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) at the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), regional office of the World Health Organization (WHO).
