Medical Specialist in Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases. Master in comprehensive management of HIV/AIDS and Doctor of medicine. He is a member of the Regional Office for the Americas of the World Health Organization (WHO), Director of Clinical Research at Fundación Huésped and President of the Argentine Society of Infectious Diseases (SADI).



Marcela Romero (ARGENTINA)

Transfeminist Argentine activist. Regional Coordinator of the Latin American and Caribbean Network of Trans People. She was president of the Association of Transvestites, Transsexuals and Transgenders of Argentina (ATTTA) and FALGBT Association. She was named "Outstanding Woman" by the Argentine Congress and was a promoter and protagonist of the drive for the Argentine Gender Identity Law. In 2017 she founded "Casa Trans" and is the director of this space.

Franco Luciano Bova (ARGENTINA)

Doctor from the University of Buenos Aires. Activist, UBA teacher, researcher and Coordinator of the Integral Health Area of "Ciclo Positivo" Association. He's the voice of the project "I = I de Ushuaia a La Quiaca" that seeks to reduce stigma and discrimination towards people with HIV. Winner of the Youth Voices award from the International AIDS Society (IAS).



Paulina Carrasco Hernández (MEXICO)

Psychologist and psychoanalyst. She was a volunteer and Coordinator of care and containment for the public at the Condesa Specialized Clinic, where she currently works in the area of mental health and psychology for detection, monitoring and adherence to antiretroviral treatment.



Benjamín Génova (ARGENTINA)

Male Trans, father of two daughters. Student of the Superior Institute of Teacher Training 12 of Neuquén. Secretary General of Trans and Non-Binary Males of Neuquén and Río Negro. LGBTIQ+ activist and member of the Argentine LGBT Federation. Referrer of the Trans Male Area of the Diversity Directorate under the Ministry of Citizenship of the Government of the Province of Neuquén.



Javier Hourcade Bellocq (ARGENTINA)

Social communicator, Master in Institutional Communication specialized in Health. 38 years of work in HIV and other health and development issues in Argentina, the region and internationally. Member of the UHC2030 Steering Committee for the OBCs and member of the CSEM. He is a member of the governing board of the Global Network of PLHIV, ICASO, the Technical Review Panel of the Global Fund and the reviewer of Positive Action of ViiV.



Erika Trejo (PERU)

Represents transsexual women in the Community Advisory Committee of Impacta Peru. Clinical Laboratory Medical Technologist, graduated from the Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia in Lima, Peru. She has worked for 12 years at the Hospital De Ventanilla of the Ministry of Health of Peru and is the first recognized Trans woman in the Peruvian state.



Maria Amelia Veras (BRAZIL)

Professor of Epidemiology at Santa Casa de São Paulo School of Medical Sciences, in Brazil. She is the leader of the research group NUDHES (Health, Sexuality and Human Rights of LGBT+ community). Her research interests include stigma and its role in health inequalities affecting the LGBT population in Brazil, barriers to access HIV/AIDS and other STIs prevention and care.
